- The Food Aid Convention was in force from 1967 to 2012
- Main objective: minimum levels of food aid on a predictable basis by commitments from members defined as wheat equivalents.
- Food Aid Convention was part of the Grains Agreement
- Member States: Australia, Canada, European Union, Norway, Japan, Switzerland, US [and Argentina]

Negotiation of the Food Assistance Convention (FAC)



- Food Aid Convention did not anymore reflect Food Assistance policies of all members
- Negotiation of the FAC from January 2011 to April 2012 under Chairmanship of Leslie Norton (CAN)
- FAC entered into force on 1 January 2013

Objectives of the FAC



Save lives, reduce hunger, improve food security, and improve the nutritional status of the most vulnerable populations by

- Commitments
- Shared principles
- Information sharing and cooperation



- Independent Convention
- Good-will treaty, no enforcement mechanisms
- No 'operational' organisation
- Open-ended convention
- FAC year = calendar year
- Official languages: English and French
- Rules of Procedures and Implementation

 - Definition of the Commitment

 - Contributions: 80% in fully grant form
- Reporting and Information sharing
- Organisational and formal issues

FAC principles



General principles

- based on needs and whenever possible fully granted
- long-term development objectives and avoid dependency
- protects livelihood and local markets, strengthen self-reliance and resilience

Effectiveness

- coordination and cooperation with relevant stakeholders
- minimize associated costs, purchase food locally and regionally
- monetization only where there is an identified need, no market development.

Accountability

Strengthen the transparency, monitoring and accountability,

- Quantity or value Commitments
- Flexible commitments, can be adapted annually
- Initial Commitments (for 2013):

Eligible Activities



- Provision and distribution of eligible products
- Cash transfers
- Commodity-based or cash-based voucher transfers
- Nutritional interventions



- •Grains, rice, soybeans; incl. prod. of primary or secondary proc.
- Pulses and root crops
- Edible oil and sugar
- •Other products part of a traditional diet, or included in food baskets
- Dairy products
- Supplementary and therapeutic feeding products, micronutrients, salt
- Fortified blended food and Ready to use food
- Fruits and vegetables
- Seeds, seedlings, and plant cuttings that relate to the previous list of products
- Basic hand-held agricultural and fishing tools
- Basic food preparation equipment
- Livestock for milk and consumption purposes

Associated Costs



- Logistical costs, incl. twinning
- Costs for program design
- Other relevant associated costs

- Report by Parties (first reports by the end of April 2014)
- Report by secretariat (1st report by the end of June 2014)
- Exchange of information at sessions and meetings
- Ad-hoc information exchange
